Vivek Wadhwa, an advocate for reform of America's high-skilled immigration system, cited the IPC in a Washington Post article focusing on DREAMers:

"There are an estimated [1.8 million children](#) [1] in the U.S. who could be classified as "illegal aliens", according to the Immigration Policy Center. They didn't knowingly break any laws. Their parents brought them to this country to give them a better future. These "DREAMers" as they are called, grew up as Americans, believing they were entitled to the same rights and freedoms as their friends. But, because they don't have the proper paperwork, they are forced to live in the shadows of society—as second-class human beings with limits on where they can work and study, and what they can do. Until recently, they would also fear being rounded up in the middle of the night to be deported to a land that they don't even remember."
